Nestled in Lake Michigan's crystal-clear waters, this hidden paradise has only **1,000 Instagram posts** of its dazzling beauty and **55 total reviews** to its name. Talk about a perfect spot to craft a reply to those work emails in peace!

"South Manitou Island offers the ideal remote work setup," explains David. "The lake views create a calming atmosphere that helps with focus and creativity."

Looking for a runner-up? Maine's **Roque Bluffs** takes silver with an impressive **99.799** peaceful score. This Atlantic gem is clearly one of the coast's best-kept secrets—only **1,000 Instagram posts** exist of its ocean vistas and peaceful work spots. Perfect for when you want your spreadsheets served with a side of serenity.

David says, "Roque Bluffs combines ocean breeze with perfect isolation. It's exactly what remote workers need for productive deep work sessions."

Claiming the bronze medal, **Enderts Beach** turns solitude into an art form. This Californian gem scored a whopping **99.775** on the peace scale, with just **500** brave souls sharing their finds on Instagram. Think private office with a Pacific Ocean soundtrack and crystalline waves for company.

"The minimal digital footprint of Enderts Beach speaks volumes," Garcia notes. "Fewer visitors means more peace for focused work and relaxation time."

Methodology

To identify the most peaceful beaches in the USA, data was gathered from several sources in January 2025 using the following methods:

- **Instagram Searches**: The number of posts with beach-related hashtags was checked on <u>Instagram</u>. Fewer posts indicate fewer visitors, suggesting a more peaceful beach.
- TripAdvisor Reviews: The number of reviews for each beach was collected from <u>TripAdvisor</u>. More reviews suggest higher visitor numbers, leading to a less peaceful atmosphere.
- Google Map Reviews: Reviews were also analyzed on Google Maps. A higher number of reviews indicates more visitors and less peace.

The **Peaceful Score** was calculated by normalizing the three indicators and assigning these weights:

- **Instagram Search**: 20% weight, as hashtag posts can overlap with other locations.
- **TripAdvisor Reviews**: 40% weight, as reviews show the actual number of visitors to the beach.
- Google Maps Reviews: 40% weight, reflecting real-world beach visitation.

Four sources were used:

- U.S. News
- <u>TripAdvisor</u>
- Travel + Leisure
- Sky Aviation Holdings.
